

Artist of 1980s talks at MoCA

The Museum of Contemporary Art in North Miami will present an lecture by painter David Salle at 1 p.m. Saturday at the museum, 770 NE 125th St.

Salle is considered one of the preeminent American artists most closely associated with painting in the 1980s.

Museum admission is required for the lecture. General admission to the museum is \$5, \$3 for seniors and students with I.D., free to MoCA members and North Miami residents. Space is limited and reservations are required by calling 305-893-6211. Salle's talk is sponsored by Joan and Michael Salke.

Exhibit shows art of the 1980s

In the first major U.S. exhibit to focus on art from the 1980s with a historical perspective, the Museum of Contemporary Art in North Miami is presenting 25 artists' work.

The exhibit, *Mythic Proportions: Painting in the 1980s*, deals with the rebirth of painting during that decade and the way the public responded. It focuses on artists who gained recognition in New York, the art center in that time.

The exhibit opens Saturday and runs until May 13. The museum is open from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays and noon to 5 p.m. Sundays. Admission is \$5 for adults, \$3 for senior citizens and students (with ID), and free for MoCA members, North Miami residents (with ID) and children under 12. The museum is located on 770 NE 125th St.
