Villa Orlandi holds a very special place in my life as an artist.



Kenny Scharf



Another artist who spent lengthy periods of time in Anacapri was **Kenny Scharf** who later became one of the leading exponents of American graffiti art and exhibited at the gallery in Naples in 1991. He first came to Villa Orlandi in the early Eighties. He was very young and graffiti art was not yet well known here. I must confess that after the rigour of Kounellis, Kenny Scharf's little figures that he would continuously paint in one go, almost seemed light-hearted to me. Instead, shortly afterwards, those "little paintings", viewed a bit condescendingly, reached remarkable prices first in the US and then here in Italy.

Francesca Alinovi introduced us to Kenny Scharf, who was very happy to be in to Capri. Francesca also stayed at Villa Orlandi and, viewed in retrospect, her drawing in the guest book, with all that red, always gave me the sensation of being something of an omen of her tragic destiny.

Luigi Ontani came in the summer, with his friend Joney and luggage filled with exotic clothing, veils, feathers and hats hung here and there throughout the house. On the occasion of the feast of the patron saint, he was determined to show up in church and take part in the procession dressed up as Saint Antonio. Pasquale had to work very hard to dissuade him.
